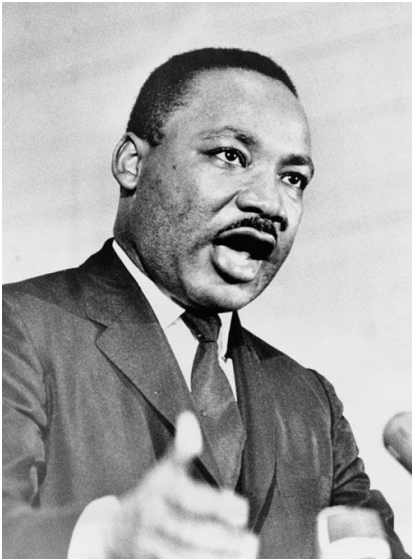

Safety plea from daughter of killed worker

THE DAUGHTER of the worker killed on the Wembley national stadium site made an emotive plea for higher safety standards in the industry last week.

Over 700 marchers heard Margaret O'Sullivan speak about her father Patrick's death at a Workers' Memorial Day rally outside the site.

Workers from Wembley downed tools and left the job in honour of their former colleague.

Ms O'Sullivan said: "I will never forget

identifying the body. Gone was everything we recognised, all the familiarities of our dad. We saw only a broken body that had been smashed. I remember how cold he felt and the blood and dirt in his hair.

"His last rites were given whilst he lay in the mud at Wembley. The last words my father heard were 'Run, Patsy, run'. What kind of terror and fear must he have felt?

"No one should have to die like my father – to be treated like fodder, just

another payroll number to be struck from the list.

"How many men have to die? How many fathers, sons and brothers must be maimed and killed before governments say enough is enough?"

She added: "The level of complacency that exists within construction would never be tolerated in any other industry. It takes a high-profile site like Wembley to highlight the appalling safety record that these men are forced to endure."
